EGYPTIAN AREA SCHOOLS EMPLOYEE BENEFIT TRUST BOARD OF MANAGERS MEETING NOTES CARLYLE, ILLINOIS December 7, 2016

I. CALL TO ORDER:

A meeting of the Board of Managers of the Egyptian Area Schools Employee Benefit Trust was held on Wednesday, December 7, 2016, at Governor's Run in Carlyle. Vice-Chairman Matt Klosterman called the meeting to order at approximately 10:00 a.m. Sign-in sheets indicated there were 70 people in attendance, including 52 representatives from 40 districts and 18 advisors and guests.

The notes of the Board of Managers meeting of September 21, 2016 were approved as submitted.

II. FINANCIAL REPORT:

Tom Dahncke reported that the audited financial statements for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2016 were complete and would be posted shortly on the Trust's website. The audited statement of net assets includes a receivable in the amount of \$3.2 million for prescription drug rebates earned on prescription drug claims in 2015 and the first six months of 2016. About \$2.5 million of that receivable was paid to the Trust in October.

Tom stated that the Trust's actuary estimated the IBNR claim reserve at \$12.5 million at June 30. The actuary increased the reserve to \$13 million in October to account for the increase in membership from adding Quincy and BASSC. Tom explained that the claim reserve is the actuary's estimate of the amount required to pay medical claims that have been incurred but not reported (IBNR). That is, these claims have been incurred but have not been submitted to Meritain or have not been paid. As of June 30, 2016, the Trust had a surplus of over \$1 million in excess of the amount held for the claim reserve.

Tom reported that on a cash flow basis July, August and September were each negative by over \$1 million. October was positive by about \$640,000, but November was also negative by over \$1 million, in part due to a large shock loss claim. By the end of November the fund balance was negative by about \$4 million. This means the Trust has sufficient cash and investment assets to pay claims, but the IBNR is not fully funded. Tom explained that over most of its 33 year history the Trust has had a fully funded claim reserve. There have, however, been a few periods when the Trust had a deficit fund balance. There is always a tension between the goals of maintaining a full reserve and minimizing premium rate increases.

III. BUSINESS ITEMS:

A. Report of TPA Services – Meritain Health.

Maria Llewellyn reported that new ID cards will be mailed around Christmas and will be effective January 1, 2017. As noted at the September meeting, the new cards are required due to Aetna's

acquisition of Coventry. The new cards will show Aetna as the provider network in all states and a new address for filing claims. Another change is that the name of the individual Plan will not be included on the ID cards.

B. Report of Prescription Drug Services – Scrip World.

Valerie Fish reported that there will be a few additions and deletions to the prescription drug formulary effective January 1, 2017. Members who will experience any negative impact from these changes will be notified individually before January 1.

C. Report of Care Coordinators by Quantum Health.

Cyndee Bronars reported that Quantum will mail the new ID cards to members. The new cards will also include information about LabCard. An insert mailed with the cards will explain that members should use the new cards starting January 1, 2017. Cyndee also noted that new cards can be printed from the Trust's website or can be downloaded on a mobile app after the first of the year.

Cyndee reported that Quantum has made some changes in its clinical programs, including expanding the number and types of medical conditions for which Quantum's nurse care coordinators will reach out to members to offer assistance in managing their health care.

D. Report of Voluntary Dental and Vision Services – Ameritas.

Kip Koll reported that Ameritas is expanding the dental network in Illinois. Ameritas has received a number of provider nominations and will be following up to add dentists to the network.

E. <u>Report of Network Services – Coventry/Aetna</u>.

Martha Bromley stated that she will be changing roles and that Tracy Jenkins will be taking her place as the Coventry/Aetna account manager for the Trust. Martha also noted that provider nominations have slowed down, but Aetna is always interested in receiving nominations for providers to be added to the network.

F. Report of Section 125, 403(b) and ACA Administration – American Fidelity.

Whitney Dyson reported that TRS issued letters about refunds payable to members due to expiration of the Early Retirement Option (ERO) program. Eligible TRS members must apply to receive a refund and can elect a cash payment or rollover into a 403(b) plan or IRA. Cash payments will be subject to 20% federal tax withholding plus a 10% penalty for early withdrawal for members under age 59½. American Fidelity is available to meet with employees to discuss refund options.

Whitney encouraged districts to use American Fidelity's HCR education website for assistance with completing the 1095 and 1094 reporting forms required by the ACA. She advised that

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Meritain will send information to each district later in the month reporting the members and dependents enrolled for each month.

G. Report on Mark to Market Plans – TCOH.

Jim Baxter and Gary Wright reported they have had excellent response to the new wellness incentive. Case managers are working directly with individuals who have health conditions that may qualify them to participate in grant programs.

H. Report of Benefits Committee.

Matt Klosterman invited members to contact Matt or Jeff Dosier if they are interested in serving on the Benefits Committee. Matt explained one recommendation for the Board's approval. The Committee recommends contracting with Karen Giles to work part-time for the Trust for a transition period. Karen will be available to Maria and Pam when they need her comprehensive knowledge of the Trust's history and operations and will work on specific projects assigned to her. Meritian has agreed to reduce its fees through 2017 to offset the cost for contracting with Karen.

Erik Frankford (Valmeyer) made a motion, seconded by Melinda Albers (West Washington), to approve the contract arrangement with Karen Giles. Motion carried.

Leo Hefner reported that Mount Vernon High School will join the Trust effective January 1, 2017.
